FIRST NATIONAL STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIP

Received a grant to collaborate with Ish Festival (Cincinnati), studying each others' models and curriculum. Grant was given by Upstart.

CONTINUED EMERGING JEWISH LEADERSHIP INCUBATOR:

Cohort 4 of the TischPDX joined us mid pandemic! Despite COVID and Zoom fatigue, we continued to refine our curriculum, adding guest facilitators/presenters, and inviting alumni to teach with us. We began developing a catalog of topic offerings with a goal of exploring the replicability of this model.



SECURED A OFFICE/VENUE SPACE:

TischPDX became one of the first organizations to make a home at the Eastside Jewish Commons, a new shared space for Jewish and allied organizations. With 6,000 square feet and a variety of rooms, EJC fulfilled TischPDX's need in 2021, not just for a workspace but also a COVIDadaptable gathering area and venue for TischPDX cohort and alum events.



INCREASE IN PUBLICITY IN 2021

TischPDX was featured in several publications both in Portland, OR and throughout the country, including: The Jewish Review, EJewish Philanthropy, Slingshot, Hey Alma, New York Jewish Week











In 2021, alumni Rachel Stern and Blair Denniberg joined our board. TischPDX donors supported us to send our alumni to a 3 month Slingshot board training for young Jewish professionals. In October 2021, TischPDX alumni, Colleen Dixon also joined our board, stepping in as our interim Board President allowing us to support our current President in a 6-month sabbatical.



STAFFED OUR GROWTH:

We welcomed a new co-director, Derekh Travers, and began the joyous work of re/imagining how TischPDX can operate day to day as it grows and matures. Co-directors are developing a valuesdriven ketubah (contract) to honor the ways we will support each other, our work, and our communities. Our budget grew generously to support new programmatic and fundraising support.









TischPDX has been steadily securing funding from local and national funders who align with our values. In 2021 we more than doubled our budget. Our co-executive director, Eleyna Fugman secured 10 new grants, resulting in over \$150,000 in new funding.

New relationships have been established with the Women's Giving Circle of the Jewish Federation of Greater Portland, The Jews of Color Initiative, Upstart, the Rodan Family Foundation, the Rise Up Fund of the Nathan Cummings Foundation, The Jewish Liberation Fund, Emily's Fund and the Zera Foundation.

Herschel Colbert, TischPDX alumni and current development & communications intern worked with our staff to secure 35 new individual donors.

Such growth requires care and thoughtfulness, and we are focused on stabilizing as we grow. We are hard at work creating systems to make sure we can effectively achieve diverse partnerships, capacity, equity and justice practices.

COVID SAFETY:

Our learning curve has been significant for meeting the various health and safety needs of our amitim (especially those who have/teach kids), and adapting as public health circumstances change.

SILVER LININGS:

Due to the pandemic, zoom fatigue, and other factors, this year put a strain on Cohort 3 in terms of relationship building, but we had high levels of attendance at our meetings and Tischpdx was able to provide a home base during these isolating times. Cohort 4, which started in Aug 2021, was able to launch in person again.

NEXT STEPS

TAKING FOUR STEPS TOWARDS GROWTH AND EQUITY IN LINE WITH OUR VALUES

EMBEDDING EQUITY

With racial and gender justice and accessibility as central tenets of our organization, TischPDX is always looking for opportunities to operationalize our values. To this end, starting in January we will begin paying monthly Real Rent to NAYA (Native American Youth and Family Center) as a way to honor the sovereignty and land connection of local Indigenous tribe members, Jewish and not, who have stewarded this place since time immemorial. We are also paying monthly Reparations to Black Oregon Land Trust as a way to show dedication to the autonomy and liberation of Black Oregonians, Jewish and not, in our communities. Additionally TischPDX is working to complete Not Free To Desist's calls for anti-racist Jewish organizations, and has budgeted for ASL interpretation as needed for future events.

🔀 INVESTING IN OUR ALUMNI

One of our learnings was that we desire ongoing relationships with our graduates, recognizing that they have so much to offer TischPDX, each other, and our diverse Jewish communities. To that end, in 2021 we have secured funding to explore ways to meet their needs and deepen our relationships with alumni through the launch of our Alumni Support Program.



TELLING OUR STORY

We hear many good things about our work, and yet nothing replaces careful qualitative data collection. Thanks to a grant from the Rodan Family Foundation, in 2022 we are hiring a sociology researcher Dr. Tobin Belzer to interview Cohorts I - 3 alongside founders and staff, and deliver feedback that will help us steady our organization as we grow, tell our story to potential funders, and examine possibilities for replicating TischPDX in other cities.

INCREASED CAPACITY

As we grow, our staffing needs are shifting. Both co-directors will increase the hours we work per week, and we will be hiring diverse contractors in our communities to fill in some of the important roles and needs of our growing organization. As a way to match our wise growth and equity practices referenced above, we are seeking to institutionalize a healthy and supportive workplace, adjusting pay and compensation to align with our Jewish values, and working to hire and pay workers in line with our commitment to racial and gender justice and accessibility.
